She was purchased privately by high profile owner Resolute Racing for a hefty price following the race. The 3-year-old filly finished a well beaten 6th last time out at Keeneland, but she had the misfortune of a tough trip in a strong allowance field. Drop the Hammer raced out of position from the start and was blocked on the far turn while seemingly full of run. She was not urged hard by Irad Ortiz Jr. in deep stretch when beaten, as he wisely saved her for another day. There's not much early speed in this race, so expect Ortiz to be aggressive right out of the gate and try for the lead despite breaking from an outside post. I also like the cut back to 1-mile for top grass trainer Graham Motion.

5 AUGUSTA MELODY 9-5 ORTIZ, JR. I RUSSELL B

Shows two solid races in a row upon getting a trainer change to Brittany Russell and returning from an 11-month layoff. Wired the field last time out at Keeneland as the 2-1 favorite while switching riders to Irad Ortiz, who is back aboard today. Has shown he doesn't need the lead to be effective, but in this field where there's a lack of early speed, Augusta Melody would make the lead and be tough to run down if allowed to slow down the fractions. Draws a perfect post but must pick up 8 Lbs. from his last race, spotting weight to all.

3 SHERIFF RONNIE 8-1 VILLALOBOS I KREISER T

In for the \$40,000 claiming tag in sharp and consistent form. Regressed a bit last time out over a sloppy track after racing out of position from the start and wide throughout. In his prior four starts, he sat up close to the leaders before attacking. Three of those races resulted in wins, along with a 2nd place finish. Has won at Pimlico in the past and 5 of his 6 wins are at this distance.

1 BAND CAMP 3-1 TORREALBA J EUBANKS A

Returns from a 7-month layoff following an excellent 2024 season. In 11 starts, he won 7 races when sitting a stalking trip or closing from farther back. Properly spotted at this level returning on Lasix. The only issue is if he will be sharp enough to win this race off such a long break. Certainly a must use in our wagers.

7 EXPLORATION 7-2 RUSSELL S RUSSELL B

With just 5 starts, he's the most lightly-raced horse in the field, but clearly has some upside. Looks to win his third straight race after defeating only 3 rivals last time out. Overcame a troubled start and a wide trip in that one and now reunites with Sheldon Russell, who rides for his wife Brittany. Steps up in class with good tactical speed.

8 CIRCLE P 9-2 CHIAPPE R STITES F

He's been facing tougher rivals his last 6 starts, all in stakes races. He was victorious once, and hit the board twice during that span. Cuts back to 6F, the distance of 3 of his 4 wins, and drops in class. Must overcome his outside post and a likely wide trip in a race which lacks much early speed.

the turf when closing boldly from far back after her rider made a premature middle-move. Makes her second start on Lasix and gets a huge upgrade in riders to the hot riding Luis Saez, who's won 28% when teaming up with good trainer Brendan Walsh in 2024-25. Sharp and steady works for her return.

3 KOBE'S SMILE

BONIFACE K

Returns from a 6-month layoff for trainer Kevin Boniface, who does well with his returnees. I like her inside draw, which should allow rider Briceno to save ground before making his move. This jock has been aboard 2 winners from 4 mounts for this barn.

8 FIVECOMMATWO

20-1 PEREZ X

PERRI G

Sharpened in a sprint last time out returning from a 5-month layoff for this spot stretching back out to a mile. Her prior 3 starts on turf resulted in an upset win and 2 third place finishes. Expected to show more speed today. 20-1 on the morning line.

10 PARADISE WINS

5-1 SANCHEZ M

TROMBETTA M

Returns from a 5.5-month layoff making her first start as a 3-year-old facing several older rivals. She's had tough trips in her last 3 starts but was able to overcome it in her maiden win three races back. Makes her first start on Lasix for trainer Mike Trombetta, who can have a horse ready to fire a big shot off the bench.

Varney was pulled up early in the race after losing his action as the 8-5 favorite. He cut back to 6F last time out at Santa Anita, where he finished a non-threatening 4th in a "key" race which produced 4 next out winners! Today Varney is clearly the one to catch stretching out to 1-1/16 miles in a race which lacks much early speed. Gets an upgrade in riders to Prat.

1 LAST MAN STANDING

3-2 ORTIZ, JR. I

PLETCHER T

Rallied from well back while making a premature middle-move going 2 turns at Tampa in his debut. Last time out he checked leaving the gate, quickly finding himself with too much to do and too little time to launch a rally good enough to be a factor. Would greatly benefit from a better start breaking from the rail with Irad Ortiz Jr. back on for trainer Todd Pletcher.

7 DRILL BABY

8-1 LOPEZ P

COMPTON G

This \$350,000 2-year-old purchase has sprinted both starts at Oaklawn. Today he stretches out to 2 turns, which he's bred well to handle. Very good trainer Greg Compton wins at a strong 31% rate (2024-25) with horses going sprint-to-route. Expect more speed today getting an upgrade in riders to Paco Lopez.

7 EPIC RIDE 5-1 PRAT F ENNIS J

All 4 of his wins have come when he's had the early lead. That won't happen today, with so much other early speed to his inside, which is expected to force top rider Flavien Prat to sit off a possible duel between Concrete Glory and Booth. Epic Ride has raced on dirt 5 times and has never finished first or second, earning two 3rd place finishes. When you analyze all 5 races, Epic Ride has run much better than it looks on paper, with legitimate excuses each time. His best chance is to stalk the expected hot pace, then to nail the leaders from behind. Getting a big upgrade in riders certainly helps. His morning line of 5-1 is certainly attractive enough to take a shot with him against his 2 pace rivals who will be far shorter prices.

6 BOOTH 7-5 ASMUSSEN E ASMUSSEN S

With only 10 starts, Booth is the most lightly-raced horse in the field, but has already proven to have a lot of class and upside. In 10 starts, he's won 6 races, 5 at today's distance, and 4 have come wire-to-wire, while 2 have been stalking up close. His versatility is a plus, as is having trainer Steve Asmussen as his conditioner. Asmussen is at his best developing quality sprinters who show up on big days with huge efforts. Asmussen's son has been aboard in 5 wins, so the familiarity with Booth more than compensates for the rider advantage Concrete Glory has with Irad Ortiz Jr. aboard. Booth loves the Oaklawn dirt surface, but does have victories at Churchill and at Keeneland.

5 CONCRETE GLORY 2-1 ORTIZ, JR. I JOSEPH, JR. S

The most experienced horse in the field with 35 starts, he returns from a 3-month layoff for top trainer Saffie Joseph Jr. Since being claimed for just \$6,250 in 2022, the 6-year-old has spent most of his time at Gulfstream, where he's won many races. With 15 career wins, he's also been successful venturing outside of Florida. Speed is his best game, and he's got plenty of it. I like the freshening, and his last 2 workouts have been outstanding. Gets reunited with Irad Ortiz Jr., who was aboard for a 4-length win 2 starts back. Must overcome the pace pressure he will encounter with the speedy Booth breaking just outside of him.

2 PRINCE OF JERICHO 6-1 RUSSELL S RUSSELL B

Cuts back to 6F after being caught in vicious duels in his last 2 starts. With quicker speed horses breaking to his outside, there's no doubt a switch to rating tactics will be employed today, which has been successful in the past. He will have to run a career-best race to have any chance of winning this stakes race, but never underestimate trainer Brittany Russell for owner Michael Dubb on marque days.

Expect her to be more forwardly placed today, getting an upgrade in riders to Luis Saez for trainer Joe Sharp, who continues to have an outstanding 2025 winning at 26% wins.

She's a "wild card" making her first U.S. start while returning from 7-month layoff. She was no factor in her last 2 starts against quality fields while facing. Her prior 5 starts against fillies were all good efforts. She's been carrying weight from 123 to 128 pounds in several of her races. Today she's in with 115 lbs and a rider change to Flavien Prat. In watching her races overseas, she does have tactical speed going 5F in 6 of her 7 starts. Any "give" to the ground is a plus.

9 MISCHIEF MAXEY

She showed huge improvement last time out switching to the turf for the first time. Won a hard fought battle at 35-1, but she was disqualified and placed 5th for impeding a rival in deep stretch under poor handling by a weak rider. Today she cuts back in distance and gets a big upgrade in jockey to Kendrick Carmouche, who has had an outstanding year riding at Aqueduct.

There's not an abundance of early speed in here, so I expect the pace to be honest, which is quick enough to help set up her late run. The question is her fitness off the bench while also trying to work out a trouble-free trip.

Since switching back to the dirt in her last 3 starts and cutting back to 6F in her last 2 while also getting blinkers back on, this lightly-raced 4-year-old has shown a lot of improvement. The winter horses she was facing at Aqueduct were clearly weaker than these, but Striker Has Dial is very sharp and is trained by a very good horseman, Horacio De Paz. I like her outside post in the field of 7. Her last 3 workouts have been excellent.

3 ONE MAGIC PHILLY

The 9-5 morning line favorite has 3 wins, and all 3 were going longer than 6 furlongs. In her lone attempt at this distance, she finished a well-beaten 2nd in her debut at Santa Anita. Today the blinkers come off for the first time in 6 starts since returning from a 4.5-month layoff. Prat returns on the 4-year-old, who is the most lightly-raced filly in the field. She's a win factor, but one who appears vulnerable, and will likely be over bet.

1 APPLE PICKER

Returns from a 9-month layoff for trainer Brittany Russell, who's won at a very strong 29% rate in 2024-25 with her returnees from layoffs of 6 months or more. Apple Picker won her debut by 6-3/4 lengths, and has another victory off a 7-month layoff. She also won this same stakes race last year, but it wasn't off a break. The 5-year-old is 2 for 2 at Pimlico and 3 for 4 at this distance. Switches back to Russell's husband, Sheldon Russell, who has been aboard in 4 of her victories.

All of her wins have come between 6 furlongs and a mile. She is versatile, which helps, and should get the right pace set up to help set up her solid stretch run. Gets a rider change to Joel Rosario, who is riding in excellent form now, and he's had success with this trainer.

This lightly-raced 4-year-old had shown quality as a 2-year-old, completing her juvenile campaign with a solid effort in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. She showed some improvement as a 3-year-old, but I get the feeling we will see a career-best race today returning to the turf, the surface of all 3 of her wins, after running well in stakes races in her last 2 starts over a synthetic surface at Turfway. She's more mature now at 4, will race at her best distance, and gets an upgrade in riders to Irad Ortiz Jr. Look for her to close well late, aided by a possible quick and contested battle on the front end.

1 DANA'S BEAUTY 6-1 ORTIZ J MAKER M

Hard-knocking 7-year-old mare has been a gem of consistency throughout her career. In 45 starts, she's hit the board 27 times, winning 12 races. Most of her success has come over synthetic surfaces, but she has won 3 races on the turf, a surface she returns to today. What makes her dangerous is her tactical speed and inside post, and how much success she's had winning without Lasix, which she cannot run on today. Reunites with Jose Ortiz, who has a win and a second, beaten a head, the only 2 times he has been aboard Dana's Beauty.

8 SPARKLE BLUE 5-1 RUIZ J MOTION H

Her last 2 starts off a 5-month layoff have been solid, including a tough trip 5th against much tougher in a Grade 2 stake at Tampa in her return. Last time out she finished a fast-closing 2nd as the favorite going a mile, which is too short for her. Today she is helped by the added distance and a likely quick pace to close into. Trainer Graham Motion, who is based at Fair Hill, points for this day each and every year.

His works at Churchill have all been solid. Trainer Dale Romans is having a career best 2025. Today he switches riders back to Derby winning jockey Junior Alvarado.

This \$525,000 yearling purchase is living up to his price tag after closing from "another zip code" in his maiden win at the Fairgrounds. He will be a much bigger price today stepping up in class, where he will have to continue to improve to be a win factor. There's enough pace to help set up his late run and trainer Joe Sharp has had an outstanding 2025.

It was no surprise that this beautifully bred son of top sire Into Mischief, purchased for \$1.2 million, would rebound from a 7th place finish last July at Saratoga in his well-bet debut. In his maiden win at Keeneland going 7F, Invictus stalked in 3rd before bounding clear in mid-stretch while racing very "greenly". He finally settled into a more fluid stride, changing to his correct lead nearing the wire. Once he did that, the 3-year-old galloped out strongly. Certainly bred well for today's stretch out to 2 turns.

9 JUST A FAIR SHAKE 6-1 RODRIGUEZ J MCKENZIE D

Showed a lot of improvement last time out stepping up in class into a stakes race at Laurel and stretching out to 1-1/8 miles. Racing without Lasix, the son of Laoban was forced to race very wide throughout after breaking from the far outer post 10. He sustained a long rally only to fall 1-1/2 lengths back of the winner, but nearly 2 lengths in front of the 3rd place finisher, who came back to run very well in last Saturday's Peter Pan at Aqueduct.

The morning line favorite must overcome a tough outside post, but this class drop after facing much tougher rivals in many of his prior starts makes him a major player. He's never attempted 1-1/8 miles, but he does have a Grade 1 win going longer last year in the Belmont Derby at Aqueduct. In a race which doesn't have an abundance of early speed, I expect John Velazquez to have him more forwardly placed, while hopefully not losing too much ground into the first turn.

Ships in from Florida for top trainer Saffie Joseph Jr. and stretches out to 1-1/8 miles, a distance he's attempted once before, with the result being a narrow defeat after setting a pressured pace from the start in a race that was run over a turf course listed as "good". Journalism's effort during the running of the 2025 Kentucky Derby proved him to be a worthy heavy favorite in the Preakness. Like many drawn among the inside half of the field, Journalism bumped with rival Burnham Square at the start, then found himself shuffled back and in mild traffic when rail horse Citizen Bull veered out in front of and into the paths of rivals to his immediate outside. Jockey Umberto Rispoli gathered Journalism up and veered in for running room in the clear along the inside. From there, Journalism enjoyed a nearly perfect trip inside before Rispoli angled him off the inside late down the backside, gaining clear running room outside rivals. Journalism gamely picked off rivals into the far turn and emerged in the clear at the top of the stretch with dead aim on tiring leaders. Journalism would lead for a moment, then stay on gamely, but he was unable to hold off the hard-closing Sovereignty.

AE Baeza, drawing into the race and finishing a strong third, stamped the Santa Anita Derby as the best Derby prep. You recall Rispoli had Journalism pinned in traffic along the inside behind a tiring leader and rival Barnes. Journalism showed tractability when forced to drop back, angle out, and then, with good energy and a steady grind, run down perfect trip rival Baeza.

The colt's connections took the necessary time for Journalism to "tell" them he was right for a run in the Preakness. Derby winners and heavily-bet strong finishing non-winners of the Derby are usually strong win contenders in the Preakness. Journalism is well drawn in post 2, should enjoy a clean break with speed to both sides, and can secure a good stalking position into and around the clubhouse turn. He will be the short betting favorite and likely winner for trainer Michael McCarthy, who won the 2021 Preakness with Rombauer.

1 GOAL ORIENTED

6-1 PRATF

BAFFERT B

With G2 Wood Memorial winner Rodriguez sidelined by injury, trainer Bob Baffert goes to his bench for the lightly-raced and undefeated Goal Oriented. The pedigree on the dam side is all class, with some lean towards turf. Dam Bizzy Carolina won two

G3 turf routes, carrying her speed to a 9-furlong win and graded stakes placings at 10 and 12-furlongs. Bizzy Caroline is a half-sister to the fabulous multiple G1 turf winner Lady Eli. Second-damsire Saint Ballado, a full brother to the great Devil's Bag, won the G2 Arlington Classic on dirt as a three-year-old. Dam Sire Afleet Alex is a Preakness stakes winner. Sire Not This Time won the G3 Iroquois and was a short neck second in the G1 Breeders Cup Juvenile. Grand Sire Ginat's Causeway won multiple Groups 1 races in Europe over turf and completed his career finishing second, also by a short neck, in the G1 Breeders Cup Classic. The pedigree throughout says stakes career on either surface.

Goal Oriented faced a competitive group of maidens on debut, a race which produced a repeat winner and two next out winners. He veered in slightly at the start, bumping with rivals, settling at the rear while climbing as the field galloped on. He then settled down into a fluid stride as the leaders hit the first call, gained steadily into the turn, looking more professional with each stride. Emerging from the far turn 5-6 wide, Goal Oriented changed to his proper lead, kicked in and drew clear in an impressive performance.

Next out on the Derby undercard over a sealed sloppy track, Goal Oriented broke cleanly, raced in and among rivals in the short run to the turn, and then pulled new rider Flavien Prat to the lead. From there the colt set an honest pace under mild pressure throughout the run down the backside, spurted clear in the lane, felt pressure from closers, and kept on gamely without being threatened.

Goal Oriented is a talented colt, and he demonstrated maturity and marked improvement in that second start. He has good cruising speed, determination, the Preakness Stakes' most successful trainer, and top jock Flavien Prat. The key to his success will be how sharply he breaks, what tactics will be employed by Nick Juarez aboard American Promise, and whether or not Clever Again will be hard sent to the lead. The break will determine of Prat will try for the lead or stalk. Either of these two styles could be employed with success.

6 RIVER THAMES

9-2 ORTIZ, JR. I

PLETCHER T

River Thames has done little wrong in his 4-race career. The pedigree suggests distance limitations. However, he just missed at 9-furlongs, and, under the right circumstances, horses like this can outrun their pedigree.

River Thames won his debut, defeating a next-out winning stable mate in Skate Away, now a two-time winner. Next out he crushed 7 rivals, an effort that earned him a shot in the G2 Fountain of Youth. That day he led to deep stretch, only to be nipped on the wire by eventual Derby winner Sovereignty. Trainer Todd Pletcher opted to avoid Sovereignty and Tappan Street in the G1 Florida Derby, and chose the G1 Blue Grass at Keeneland as River Thames' final Derby prep. In the Blue Grass, River Thames hopped at the start, which perhaps cost him early position. Jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. got him to relax before angling off the inside for a wide trip in the 3-4 paths down the backside behind East Avenue's strong pace, with that rival being loose on the lead. River Thames continued wide but was slow to change leads while running on and gaining on the tiring leaders. From there, this colt was engaged by deep closer and eventual winner Burnham Square, the main beneficiary of that strong pace. River Thames fought hard to the wire in a solid effort but was beaten less than a length.

Todd Pletcher pointed River Thames to this race and I expect a good effort for a Hall of Fame trainer who remarkably has never won a Preakness.

7 SANDMAN

4-1 VELAZQUEZ J

CASSE M

Sandman's declaration of entrance into the Preakness was followed by a Blood Horse article recounting the colt's pre-Derby foot issues. As part of my preparation, I constantly scour sources and resources on the health of horses I expect to handicap for my selections. If it is to be known, I'm going to know it for myself and my customers. The release of this article on Monday, May 12 was stunning. Millions of dollars were wagered on this horse on May 3. The hype from an internet "influencer" and a connection to the band Metallica further promoted this horse to the betting public. And, just before the second leg of the Triple Crown, Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse revealed Sandman experienced sore foot issues, resulting in shoe changes prior to the Derby. "Nuff said..."

Sandman's G1 Arkansas Derby effort was a bias-aided victory behind an unnecessary, silly, suicidal pace duel. As a result, I was dead set against Sandman as a win contender in the 2025 Kentucky Derby, using him only on the bottom end of a few tickets. Be it the effort at Oaklawn, the newly announced sore feet, or the track delivered to fans and horses on Derby Day, Sandman, in my opinion, had no visible excuse for the effort. He experienced no mishap at the start. He was away cleanly from post 17 and kept clear outside while avoiding any crush from other horses. When jockey Ortiz, Jr. asked him leaving the backside, Sandman was beaten to the punch, bumped and passed by a rival while seeking a running lane. He never made any move and raced one-paced throughout.

Which Sandman will break from the gate this Saturday? At times in his 9-race career, Sandman has raced more forwardly. Are the foot issues far enough behind him to not be a factor again? Casse quoted legendary trainer Allen Jerkens, saying, "Run em when they're good." Casse is saying Sandman is good. Given what we have seen, and what we think we know, Sandman is a tough horse to trust to win, but he can certainly be a factor late to land a piece if the fractions are fast enough, and there's a meltdown of the speed late.

4 HEART OF HONOR (GB)

Heart of Honor is one of many new shooters entered in today's Preakness Stakes with legitimate question marks. It has been reported that this colt was purchased for connections whose stock felt overmatched by Godolphin in Middle Eastern turf racing, and looked for a potentially good dirt horse. They appear to have found one in Heart of Honor, out of three-time turf winning Chilean mare Ruby Love. Her sire, Scat Daddy, was all dirt, winning the G2 Sanford and G1 Champagne Stakes on the NYRA circuit before a troubled trip in the G1 Breeders Cup Juvenile behind winner Street Sense. In his first race as a 3-year-old, Scat Daddy prepped in the G3 Holy Bull. He went on to win both the G2 Fountain of Youth and G1 Florida Derby, both at 9-furlongs. Scat Daddy suffered a troubled trip from post 12 in the 2007 Kentucky Derby, his last career start. Sire Honor A. P. is a son of G1 Santa Anita Derby, G1 Belmont Stakes, and G1 Breeders Cup Classic winner A. P. Indy. In an abbreviated 6-2-3-0 career, Honor A. P. won the G1 Santa Anita Derby and placed fourth in the 2020 Kentucky Derby, before moving to stud duties.

Heart of Honor has never been out of the exacta in his 6-2-4-0 career. He has faced fields of 9 or more and his last three placings were in a Group 3, a listed stakes race, and the G2 UAE Derby. His running style places him in mid-pack of Euro-style racing, which might have him more to the rear facing quality American speed/stalking types.

Two races back in the listed Al Bastikiya at Maydan Racecourse, regular rider Saffie Osborne had him inside in mid-pack behind a moderate pace. When asked, Heart of Honor moved out and up in between rivals, found clear running in the lane, and closed determinedly, just falling a head short. The winner, Galactic Star, sat a perfect trip just off the pace and made first run on the leader, barely holding off Heart of Honor. Last out in the UAE Derby, rider Osborne had Heart of Honor covered up early and opted to ask for run earlier than two races back, moving up to and in between the leaders. These three battled to the wire, with Derby also ran Admire Daytona narrowly holding sway. Under intense pressure in the vice between rivals for the length of the stretch, Heart of Honor failed to change leads but battled gamely, dropping back a tad, then coming again at the leader while still on the wrong lead, a heart wrenching defeat for the connections.

Admire Daytona's effort or non-effort in the Kentucky Derby is irrelevant to Heart of Honor's prospects in Saturday's Preakness Stakes. Heart of Honor is bred for the main track, has twice successfully handled today's distance, and runs on gamely. He could blow up the tote board, or merely blow up.

8 CLEVER AGAIN

The key to any success he has in the Preakness is dependent on the start of the race. Clever Again stretches out in distance after wiring the field in a career-best race going a mile at Oaklawn. He breaks very sharply from the gate, and if he's able to establish the early lead, he could carry his speed a long way. Getting the lead is dependent on how aggressive jockey Nick Juarez will be aboard American Promise, and what tactics will be employed by Goal Oriented. If those two break ahead of Clever Again, he's likely done while breaking from post 8, with those 2 speedsters in posts 1 and 3. He's bred very well on both his sire and dam sides to love a distance of ground.
